This is the 40th Year Anniversary of the Refugee Act of 1980 which created the US Refugee Admissions program with a clear and broad initiative to resettle and welcome refugees. This is a time to remember and celebrate the incredible successes refugees have brought to this country, and to stand together to ensure this great law is not undermined but remains intact through the love and compassion of communities who care.

On World Refugee Day this June 20th we commemorate the 40th Anniversary of the bipartisan Refugee Act of 1980 and we celebrate refugee contributions to America over the last 40 years and during this present time of the COVID-19 public health crisis.
